The italic form was designed to resemble the equation italics of Mathematics text books of the late 1800's.

The Munson font has regular, *italic*, **bold** and *bold-italic* styles.

The Munson font comes with several Open Type features like SMALL CAPS, old style numbers, ordinals and localisation for several European languages.

The Munson font is free for both commercial and non-commercial use.
